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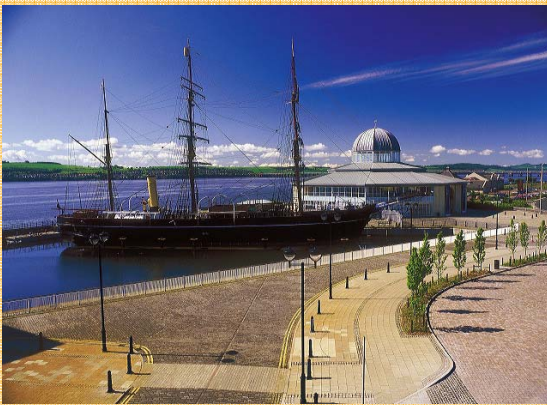
Future CMAS Meetings

Dundee 2010

“The Discovery of Hidden Aspects of Gait Analysis”

Preparations are well under-way for the 9th annual meeting in Dundee. Dates for the meeting are **29th—30th March 2010**. It will be hosted by the Institute of Motion Analysis and Research (IMAR) at the University of Dundee. The theme of the meeting is the discovery of hidden aspects of gait analysis. What elements do we need to scrutinise in our assessment of normal and pathological gait. What technology is available in this quest, and what is still missing? Key-note speakers have already been invited and include Mr Alf Bass, Professor Nachiappan Chockalingham and Dr Ilse Jonkers. The meeting will include an advanced education element (see below) on the Monday, with the main meeting and AGM held on the Tuesday. A dinner will be held on the Monday night at the Invercarse Hotel, which will include a traditional Scottish Ceilidh and dance demonstration! EDUCATION UPDATE



It has previously been decided that the 2 main education roles of CMAS are:

1. To support local provision of basic training courses:
2. To provide training in advanced aspects of motion analysis

To facilitate the first role, there will be a new “members only” section of the website (see page 3) which will hold a deposit of resources to support basic education. Please feedback to Julie Stebbins or Phil Glithero any suggestions you have regarding this.

Advanced training will be conducted in conjunction with the development and refinement of the CMAS Standards. It is envisaged that in future, topics for education will be identified through the auditing process. These education sessions will be combined with consensus meetings and held on a bi-annual basis (to be reviewed).

The first meeting will be held in October (see page 3) and include education, discussion and consensus on calibration spot checks. All are welcome to attend.

The second topic will cover electromyography and be held in conjunction with the 2010 meeting in Dundee. It is hoped that there will be invited speakers to talk about specific elements of EMG in clinical practice, a discussion/ forum, and a consensus meeting. This will take place on the Monday (29th March) of the CMAS annual meeting.

Standards Update

All the labs which have been involved in the standards process are now eligible for formal registration. Statement of Purpose forms have gone out and most have now been returned. The information from these forms will soon be available on the CMAS website and labs will be listed as 'Participating in the CMAS standards exercise'. Each of the labs has also been asked to send in nominations for external auditors.

Labs will receive their first visit from two external auditors before the next AGM. After the next AGM a second external audit will take place. If all goes well labs will then be able to be accredited by CMAS.

Most of the labs currently involved in the standards process have been participating since the start. We will soon be ready to bring other interested labs into the process. If your lab might be one please send contact details to Sally Durham, then we can let you know of future developments.

The next labs working group meeting will be on **October 16th in Nottingham**. This is an open meeting for anyone who would like to attend. We will be discussing the standards and auditing in the morning. In the afternoon we will be holding our first Education Consensus meeting. These meetings will each take a different theme and the conclusions reached will be used to update the standards. In October we will be look-

ing at calibration and spot checks of laboratory performance. Do you have interesting and novel techniques you use in your lab? If so please let Gill Holmes know and she will include you in the programme. The second meeting will be attached to the next AGM in March and will be on the theme of EMG. Again if you have any contributions please let Gill know.
